


Museum Minute | Earth from Above

Create Art Outside!

Get inspired by the Earth to create your own artwork!



Instructions:

Step 1: Look at photos of Earth taken from orbit for inspiration. See the Observing Earth from Above sheet for examples. You can try to re-create one of the photos, make artwork inspired by the photos, or let your imagination go wild!

Step 2: Go outside and gather natural materials. (DonÕt touch anything that may be harmful!) Arrange the materials into different shapes and designs. Try making a miniature landscape, with mountains, rivers, lakes, forests, cities, roads, etc.

For younger children, you can also go on a scavenger hunt to Þnd interesting shapes in nature. See if you can Þnd natural materials in the shapes from the Earth photos.

Step 3: Take a photograph of your artwork from above. Do you see anything new? What colors, shapes, or designs do you notice? Does it remind you of anything? Pretend you are a satellite taking a picture!
